- You should indicate two options from the list of topics that best suit your paper. The Review Committee reserves the right to select the most appropriate session for the abstract
- Authors' names should be provided in the format 'A. Smith'. The submitting author should be the presenting author
- The title should be a maximum of 150 characters, typed principally in lower case letters, using capitals only where essential. The preferred font is Arial 10, please check spelling and format your abstract before submission
- The abstract may be a maximum of 2000 characters (approximately 250 words). Abstracts exceeding this limit will be truncated
- The abstract should be structured using the following headings
 For original work Objective, Methods, Results and Conclusions
 - For case reports no headings
- The abstract should be as informative as possible and
 - mention statistical methods where appropriate
 - ONE table may be included but no photographs, figures or references
 - statements such as "results will be discussed" or "data will be presented" will not be accepted
 - non-standard abbreviations should be described in full when first mentioned followed by the abbreviation in parentheses



and was the world's first iron hulled armoured Battleship. The ship has been moored in Portsmouth on The Hard, since 1987. Visitors are invited to explore the four huge decks at their leisure and staff will be available to answer questions. The ship provides a wonderful setting for a conference party.
